

The Foundation and its network of physicians, industry supporters, and affiliates have been informing and engaging a wide audience about participation in the DETECT study to provide

valuable input on addressing significant research questions and we hope you consider joining in.

As a participant in the DETECT health study, you will be asked to share your resting heart rate and other health information, including virus symptoms anonymously with scientists at Scripps. This real-time, crowd-sourced information could help complement traditional public health methods, leading to earlier detection and containment of current and future outbreaks in different geographical locations.
